The host family had similar habits as me (except for the food that was very meaty, as my host family came from Argentina). I was able to adapt quickly, and I got used to their everyday life. They were very open and gave me a lot of freedom, which also made it easier for me to settle in.

In Spain I had the feeling that the people are in a better mood, very happy and funny. Time is less important; you sit together and forget about it completely. I miss that a little bit here in Switzerland. About school: I think it is a great advantage to go to a public school: you learn the language much faster
